Changes in Attitudes

As many of you reading know, we have experienced what is our first squall as a Board, but it is a good change in the weather. As an organization we are in the midst of election time and the dreaded by-laws! Elections are simple, but by-laws are always tricky. In general, clubs like to write them once and because they are time consuming and long, they stay that way. However, times change.

With times changing comes changes in the way we operate, and years do not go by without costs increasing. How many of you have it in your by-laws to still be sending items by mail...not electronic! Actual mail with a stamp! These need review Club Leaders.

The by-laws committee, that none of our Board were on, did an amazing job of providing what they felt, and we all agreed, were good changes to the PHiP by-laws. The one area we as a Board felt needed help was driven by our smaller clubs that in the last 2 years have repeatedly reached out and asked for help. Look at these current figures:

- ◆ The amount that clubs pay per member ranges from \$1 to \$7.50
- 4 clubs are paying over \$6 per member
- 30 clubs are paying over \$3 per member
- ◆ 70 clubs are already paying over the proposed \$2 per member fee (a little more than a third of the clubs)
- ♦ 116 clubs are paying over \$1 per member (more than half the clubs)

So the question became, how do we help our smaller clubs financially, not only with fair dues but then help them and their regions host events that will hopefully draw in other clubs, create new clubs, raise money for charity, gain members, and educate the Club leaders by getting them together.

The concept is simple, and of course no one ever likes to hear the words dues change, and there is never a right time for it. The fact is that all costs are going up. Our initial plan to

provide \$750 per region to an event which we know won't even cover the cost of a band. But it is a start and this dues structure has not changed for as long as we can remember. A fair, across the board increase will help our smaller clubs (one club will actually save \$55 per year in dues even with the increase!!) and help provide financial support to jump start regional events. We are reviewing the budget and costs to save money and hope to do more, but it has to start somewhere.

We can't change our latitude without changing our attitude. Let's make it fair and better for everyone in our Parrothead Nation.

You'll also reduce the waiting times for everyone, especially yourselves! Keep them coming at MOTMVAX@gmail.com, where your private data will be treated with the greatest sensitivity and entered into one of the most secure databases on the market today.

All attendees and participants at MOTM are required to provide a negative PCR covid test result from within 72 hours of registration. Temperature checks will be conducted at the door upon arrival each day. The testing requirement is waived for anyone willing to voluntarily provide proof of full vaccination, which may be done at time of registration or in advance at motmvax@gmail.com.

Grammy Winner Kristian Bush, Joins MOTM 2021 Lineup

Grammy and CMA winner Kristian Bush, half of the Sugarland duo, has been added to the MOTM21 Musical LIneup. Though best known for his partnership in one of country music's most successful acts of the 21st century, Kristian has written and recorded some of the best beach music ever produced in recent years and will be displaying his considerable tropical talents on the "75" Beach Stage at the 29th Annual Meeting of the Minds in Key West on November 6.

Kristian, who has won six BMI songwriter awards to go with his Grammy, CMAs and ACM awards, has been making a series of marks on the music world for three decades, beginning with his collaboration in the duo Billy Pilgrim. But of greatest interest to Parrot Heads traveling to Key West for the 29th Annual Meeting of the Minds is his exquisite 2019 EP "Summertime Six Pack," in which he teams with some of Nashville's top songwriters on a slick collection of a half dozen cleverly written tunes that would fit any of the genre labels used by Parrot Heads to describe their favorite music - Beach Country, Trop Rock, Coastal Americana, Tropical Americana.

This year, RITS chose to feature an all-Texan lineup beginning with Jerry Diaz, Mark Mireles and Alex Oulapour delighting early arrivals at a Thursday night pre-event pizza party. On Friday and Saturday, Robert Greaney, Dennis Davis, David Schwope and Donald James provided the poolside entertainment along with the popular Buffett tribute band, Lost Shaker of Salt, the headline performers for a three-hour stint Saturday afternoon. When the musicians weren't performing, it was time for pool games and contests with Palapa Mac Radio on hand to spin up the appropriate accompaniment.

The main event though came on Saturday morning when Galveston Bay's 'Fancy Nancy' Boling squared off against Lone Star PHC's 'Bloody Mary Gerry' Norvell in a battle of rival hangover curing tomato elixirs. This event has become so popular that Dripping Springs

Distillery put up the vodka just to have a part in the epic showdown. Like all North Texas vs South Texas contests, a difference in style was showcased. Nancy is old school, painstakingly infusing her vodka with peppercorns, adding just the right



amount of horseradish and a secret blend of spices, to get the perfect kick. Gerry, on the other hand, prefers a more mellow drink and infuses his vodka with rum. Nothing like drinking two liquors before noon to mellow you out for the day. Perhaps appropriately the voting ended in a tie necessitating a rematch

next year. No redrinks, revotes or recounts were allowed.

In the evenings the event moved from 'Beach Daze' to 'Tiki Nights' going indoors to a ballroom lavishly



decorated to this year's Tiki Bar theme. There the Detentions, the Jonas Lorence Band and Donny Brewer and the Dock Rockers performed on a palapa tiki bar stage while the partygoers danced under the tiki totem gods. On Saturday afternoon the ballroom was turned over to Donny Brewer for a musician/songwriter showcase in the style of Pirates and Poets or Fools on Stools. Joining him were Jonas Lorence and Dan Sullivan.

walkers, and over 1,000 supporters to get us to our 80% of goal.

Our goal again this year is \$100,000 (Silver Level) and we have now surpassed that



figure. The walks are not over, and anyone can donate for this year's walk up to December 31st.

Here are two individuals who go above and beyond for their work on the Alzheimer's Walks. They are ranked one and two as individuals raising the most money from our Parrot Head Team.

This year, they have raised \$8,008.00.

Linda Masten of the METRO Parrot Head Club. She has a very personal reason to raise money and awareness for the Alzheimer's Association. She has raised \$6,381.00.

We have too many others who have done such good work on their Alzheimer's teams to list them all, but I must say "Thank you" from PHIP and The Alzheimer's Association. All of your efforts are very much appreciated.

We have been walking for Alzheimer's Association for many years and have raised over One Million dollars. That is something to be very proud of, Parrot Heads!!!

In the midst of a pandemic, hardy groups of partiers still found ways to provide much needed help to their communities. They are known as Parrot Heads. These are their stories.

The 5 O'Clock Phlock has been busy promoting great music and doing great work for the last 6 months. We've logged 106 service hours since late July when we did our first project - this is a group that is big on giving back to the community by rolling up their sleeves. We created candy rolls from toilet paper cores for indigent kids. We made craft bags for Texas Children's Hospital The Woodlands patients and their siblings. We collected several thousand corks and have sent them off for recycling. In thanks for our support of the hospital, TCH let us decorate their children's library window for August in true Parrot Head form! All the nurses and families said they loved "the Jimmy Buffet Vibe" all month!

In July, Coastal Jersey PHC had it first gatherings since Covid restrictions were lifted for NJ Restaurants. We celebrated our 18th Charter year and managed to raise and additional \$2000.00 for our Relay for Life Team at a John Frinzi local appearance. This brought us to #1 team and #1 individual for the event.

Although the 2021 Parrothead Phrenzy concert benefit for Alzheimer's Project, Inc. was cancelled, the Tallahassee Parrothead Club continued with two online auctions and a website initiative that raised \$19,455 for the local organization that takes care of the caregivers of persons with dementia. Quite a success for a cancelled event!

Tampa Bay Parrot Heads donated \$1500 to USF Endowment for Marine Sciences and gave 129 work hours to Keep Hillsborough County Beautiful.

On Saturday, September 18th The Hautian Ocean Parrot Head Club took part in the Terre Haute, IN Walk to End Alzheimers. Our little club of only 15 active members had 8 members plus 3 family/friends participate in the walk. Despite the low numbers, our club was able to generate a total of \$800.00 in donations!

On August 25, Austin Texas PHC held an event called Walk The Plank. A full day of Trop Rock music at The Boat in Austin, Texas. We are pleased to announce that we were able to raise \$10,578 for B.I.G. Love Cancer Care here in Austin, Texas!

In July, the San Diego Parrot Head Club partnered with another non-profit Old Mission Beach Athletic Club (OMBAC) in an Over The Line baseball tournament raising Money for San Diego Youth Sports Organizations. In late August we kicked off our Christmas Toy Drive for the Marine Toy Drive.

The Parrothead Club of Eastern Mass has had a busy September. We had two national beach clean ups through coast sweep and the clean swell app that sends the info directly to the national organization. We have been cleaning at least 2 beaches for over 20 years now. This is always such a great community service event. We clean for a few hours then we socialize over some lunch and beverages.

The Parrot Head Club of Tidewater participated in the Walk to End Alzheimer's on Saturday, September 25th. We had a nice team of volunteers and walkers participate and we have raised \$3,530.

The Coast of Carolina Parrothead club held our 25th anniversary Throwback Shell Beach Party on September 17 and 18th and we raise \$15,000 for local charities.

PHINdy PHC of Indianapolis held our annual fundraiser Playin' n Givin' on September 25 and raised \$6500 for the PourHouse.



San Antonio Parrotheads Enjoy a Busy Summer Helping a Variety of Charities

You might expect Parrotheads in San Antonio to spend their summer relaxing on the famed Riverwalk enjoying their favorite frozen concoctions. Yet that didn't stop the club from amassing an impressive number of charitable activities during the hot summer days.

In July, 27 members had a Volunteer Work Day on July 10th at the San Antonio Food Bank. They also collected school supplies to support the Northeast ISD McKenny Vento Project. This supports homeless children by ensuring they will have supplies for the school year. \$800 worth of supplies were donated.

At the August 15th House Concert at "Lakeside Lanai" non-perishable food and money was collected to donate a combined \$400 to the New Braunfels Food Bank. On August 19th they raised money with a raffle of a parrot screen divider, collected items for the Battered Women's Shelter, and \$500 worth of supplies were donated.

On Sept 16, they collected monetary donations for the Elf Louise Project to provide toys to children that might not have anything for the holidays. They also collected \$1000 which was then donated for Elf Louise on Sept 23rd for the citywide "Big Give" and made a \$400 donation for the Battered Women's shelter.

SAPHC presented a check of \$1000 to the Amos Rehabilitation Keep (wildlife and sealife rescue organization) from funds we raised at our Survive event PokSAer Run in support of the ARK.

They donated \$2000 to our Alzheimer's Walk team with proceeds from various charity events.

SAPHC has been a San Antonio United Way Volunteer Group of the Year in 2014.
